Pretrial Supervision in Dane County

Presented by Esqueda and Rebecca Trolinger, Dane County Pretrial Services

Discussion ensued regarding autonomy and oversight of pretrial services as an agency. For example, can pretrial services scale back on supervision for a defendant who is following all rules and making all check-ins without issue independently, or do they require court order? Further conversation focused on communication and mutual understanding between judges and pretrial services. Committee members also discussed the role of the PSA as a guide for pretrial services supervision.

PSA Quarterly Review

Presented by Isabel Anadon

This review was originally presented to the CJC at their December meeting during the A2J site visit. This is the last report from randomized control trial, as there is no further randomization. Future reports will have PSAs for all eligible people, not half of this population. The presensation reviewed key takeaways, demographics, and charge information. Discussion ensued regarding how holds, charge modifiers, and charge enhancers are interpreted in this analysis.
