D. Presentations

Dane County Pretrial Changes: 2014-2019

Presented by: Clark-Bernhardt, with additional comments from Esqueda and McNamara

Presentation provides a historic overview of the Pretrial Services subcommittee, which began in 2014. The pretrial services program began in 2015, and the Public Safety Assessment (PSA) study with Access to Justice Lab through Arnold Ventures started in 2017.

Discussion among council members occurred about the balance between public safety and the presumption of innocence. Further information about the rate of failure to appear among different pretrial populations is needed because there are a wide variety of reasons that someone might not appear to a court date (including transportation). Potential for analysis based on failure to appear by zip code. Further discussion about the potential for court date reminder texts, which is currently a voluntary program that people can opt into. Council members also discussed the potential to make referrals and recommendations about treatment programs and specialized courts, but this would be outside of the scope of the PSA.
