Presented by NIC team for Transition from Jail to Community (TJC)

An explanation of the program was provided. The program has had a very positive impact on reentry in other sites; evidence-based model; CJC to review broad performance members to hold the program accountable; target treatment to reduce criminogenic risk factors; triage matrix to prioritize needs; risk screening to determine appropriate resources; transition planning for reentry.

Recommendations: CJC as steering committee for TJC; regular check-ins; Jail Reentry Team to function as TJC Implementation Team or core team; add evidence-based practices in jail and train staff
