# PRETRIAL SERVICES SUBCOMMITTEE

#### **HISTORY**

The Subcommittee started in 2014. Community members were added with 2022 Ordinance Amendment 28.



### **MISSION**

The Subcommittee supports Dane County's goal of promoting effective pretrial services, by identifying and promoting best practices.

#### **MAJOR INITIATIVES**

- Worked with Harvard's Access to Justice Lab to implement and evaluate the effects of the Public Safety Assessment, a tool designed to estimate the likelihood that people will appear in court and remain arrest-free while on pretrial release. The study determined that in Dane County, the PSA did not have an effect.
- Hosted Community Conversations with local and national pretrial justice experts.
- Collaborated with a national policy group to develop a descriptive analysis for individuals with pretrial status.
