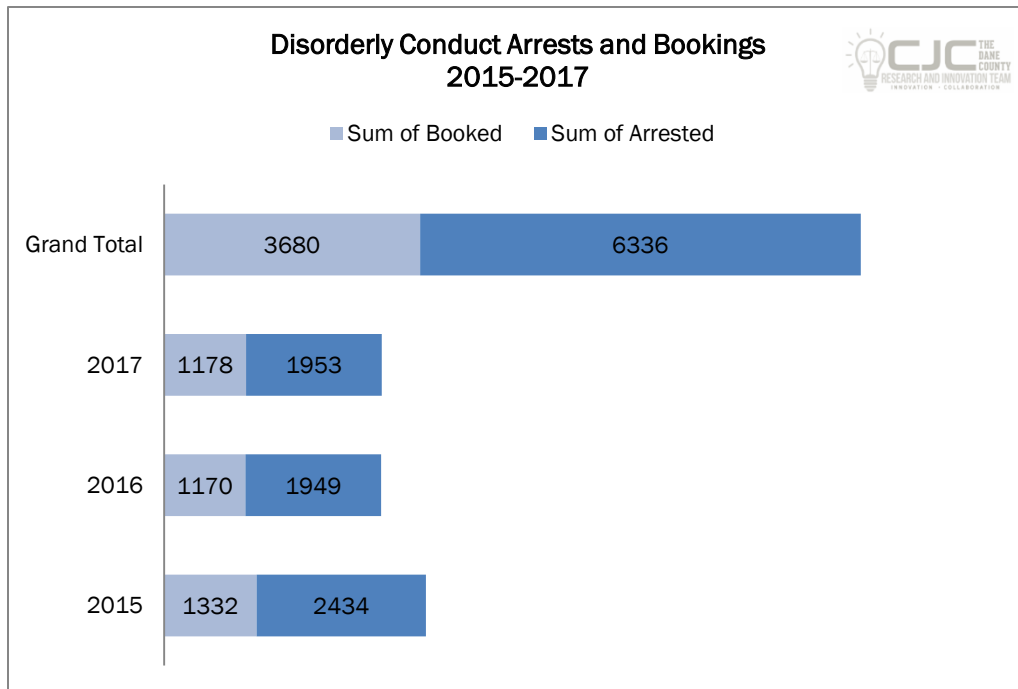

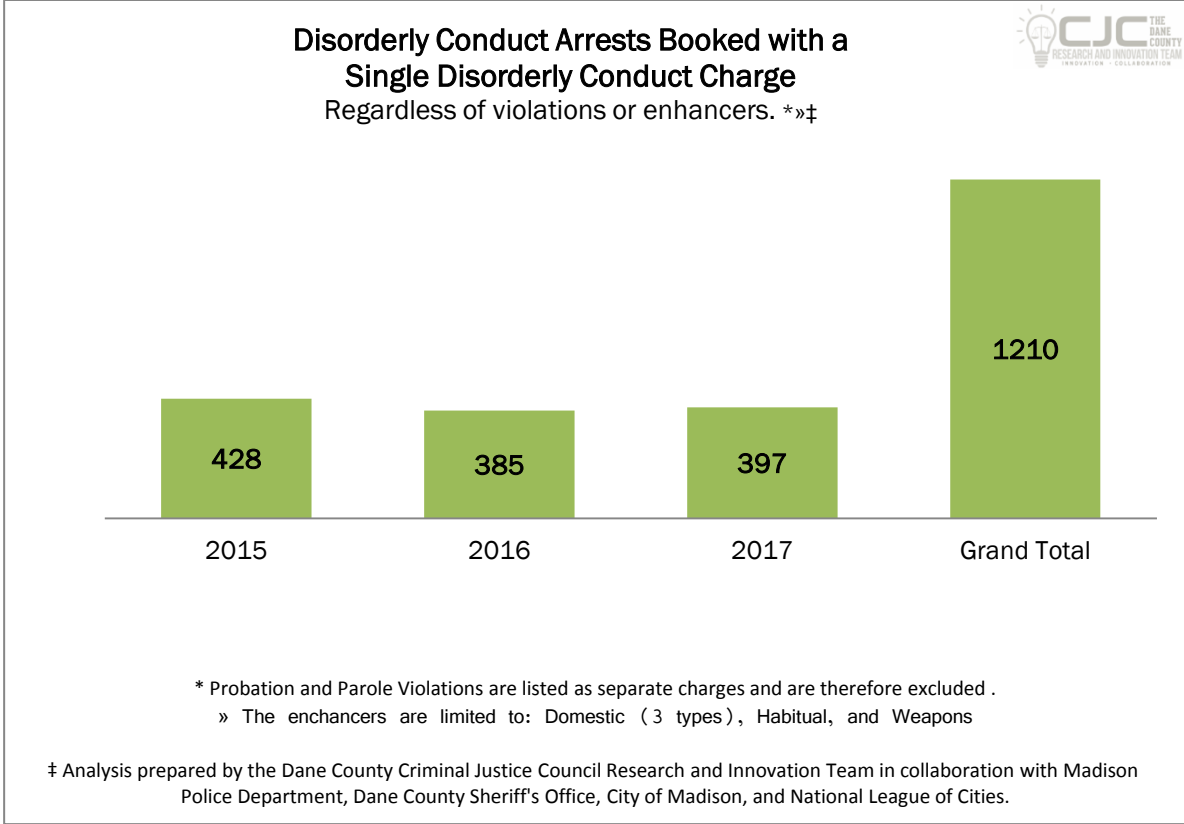
**Preliminary Results for Madison Police Department Disorderly Conduct Arrests
 Matched to Dane County Jail Booking Records**

For this analysis, the research team was provided a dataset with 7,477 records, of which 445 duplicates and 696 juvenile records were removed, leaving 6,336 records for this analysis. The criterion for selection was as follows: Arrests of Adults, one record to represent each incident of arrest which was matched to one record representing an instance of booking.

Dane County Sheriff’s Office provided the Dane County CJC research team with booking records for the same time period covering arrests originating with the Madison Police Department, using the indicator “MAPD” for arresting agency. The number of records were further reduced by limiting to those with at least one arrest charge of Disorderly Conduct, resulting in 3,680 booking records to match up to the 6,336 arrest records.



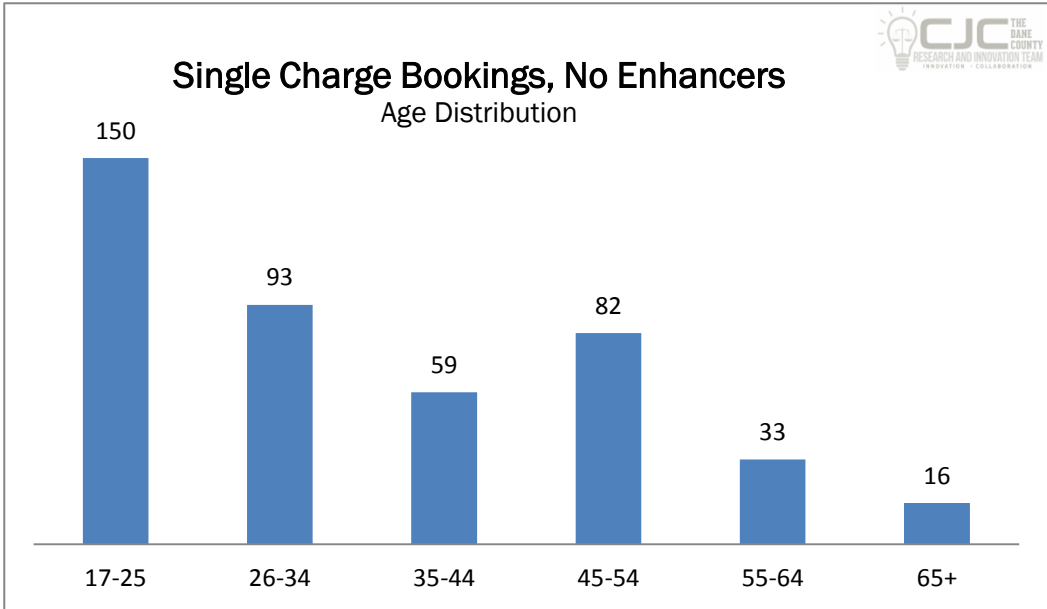
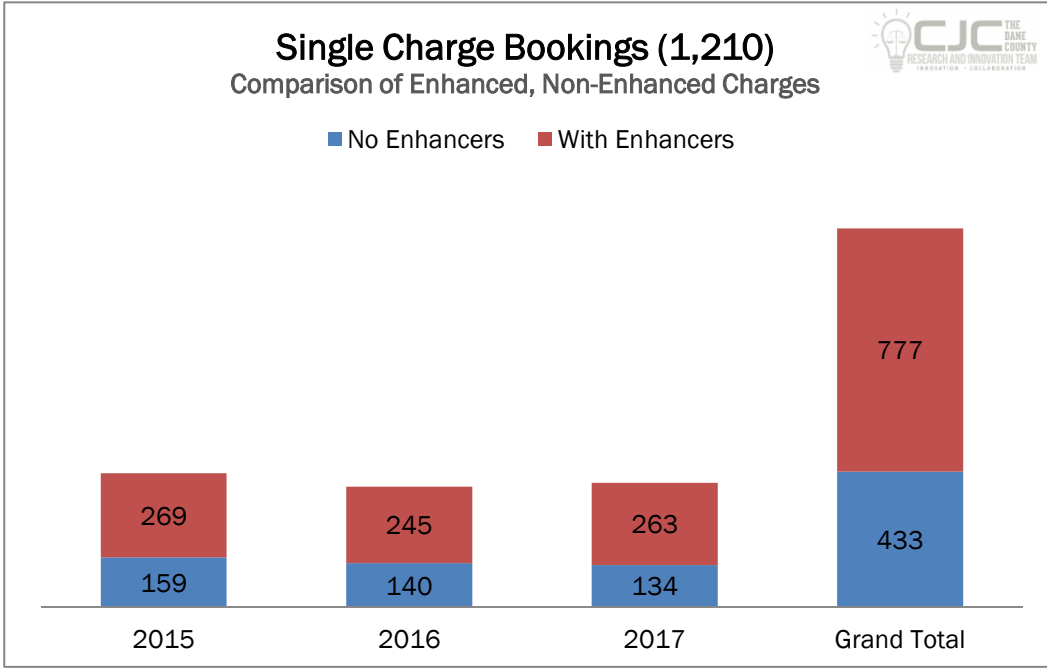
How to read this chart: The smaller number in each bar represents the number of arrests leading to a subsequent booking, therefore of the total 6,336 arrests, 3,680 were subsequently booked.



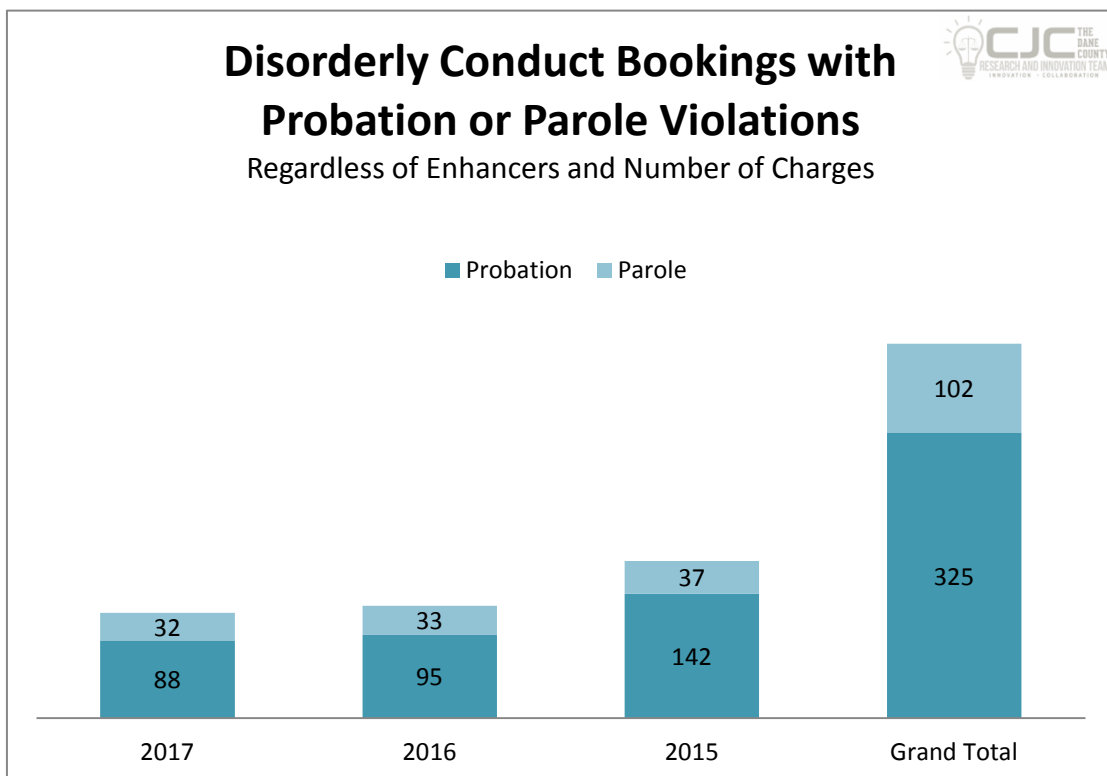
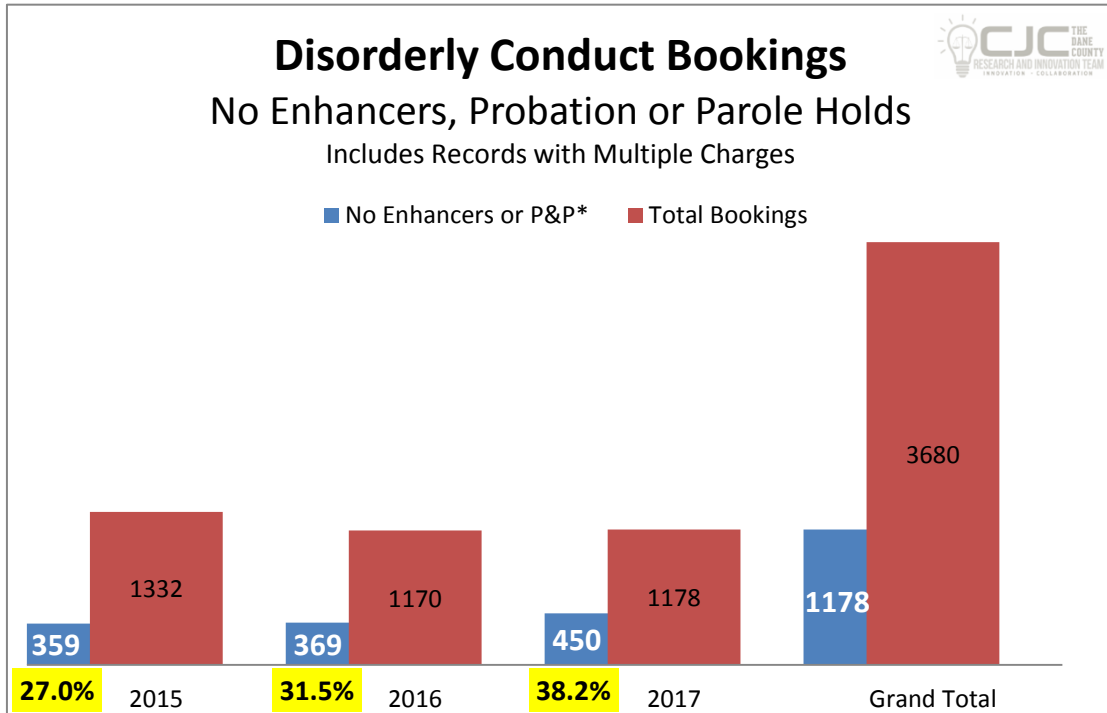
Arrest charges that lead to jail booking may be comprised of state statute charge and any enhancement on the statute charge. It is critical to review both the number of charges, and any enhancement that are charged.

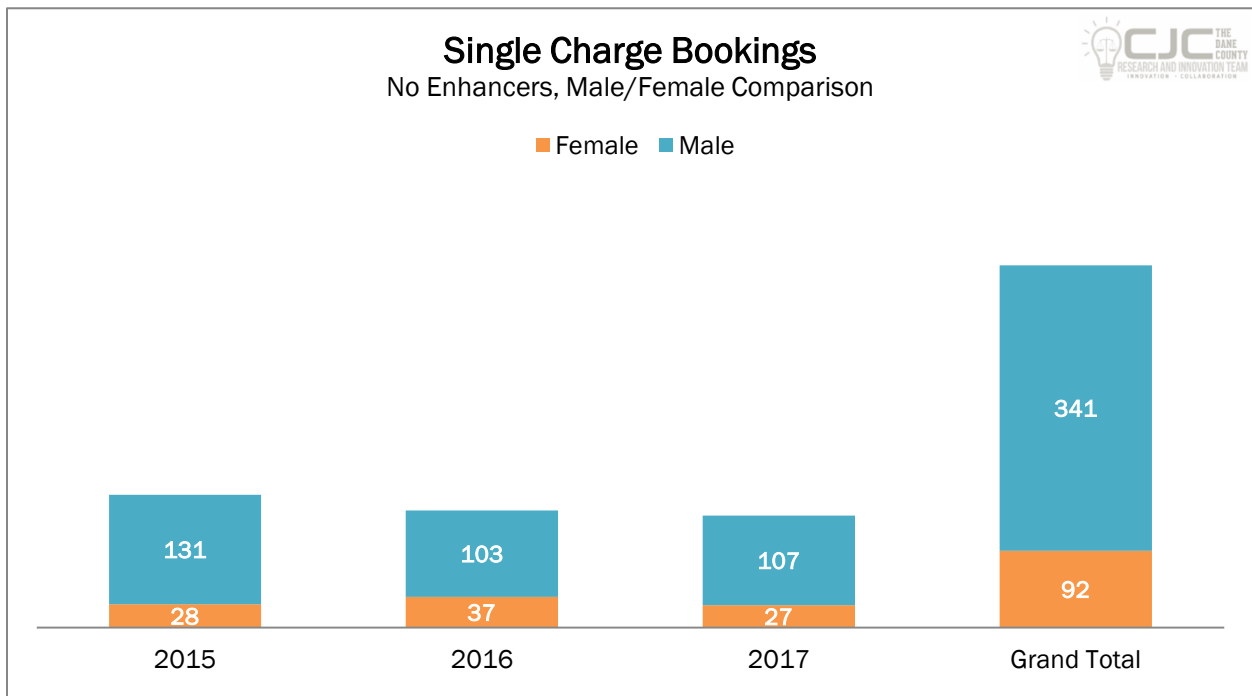
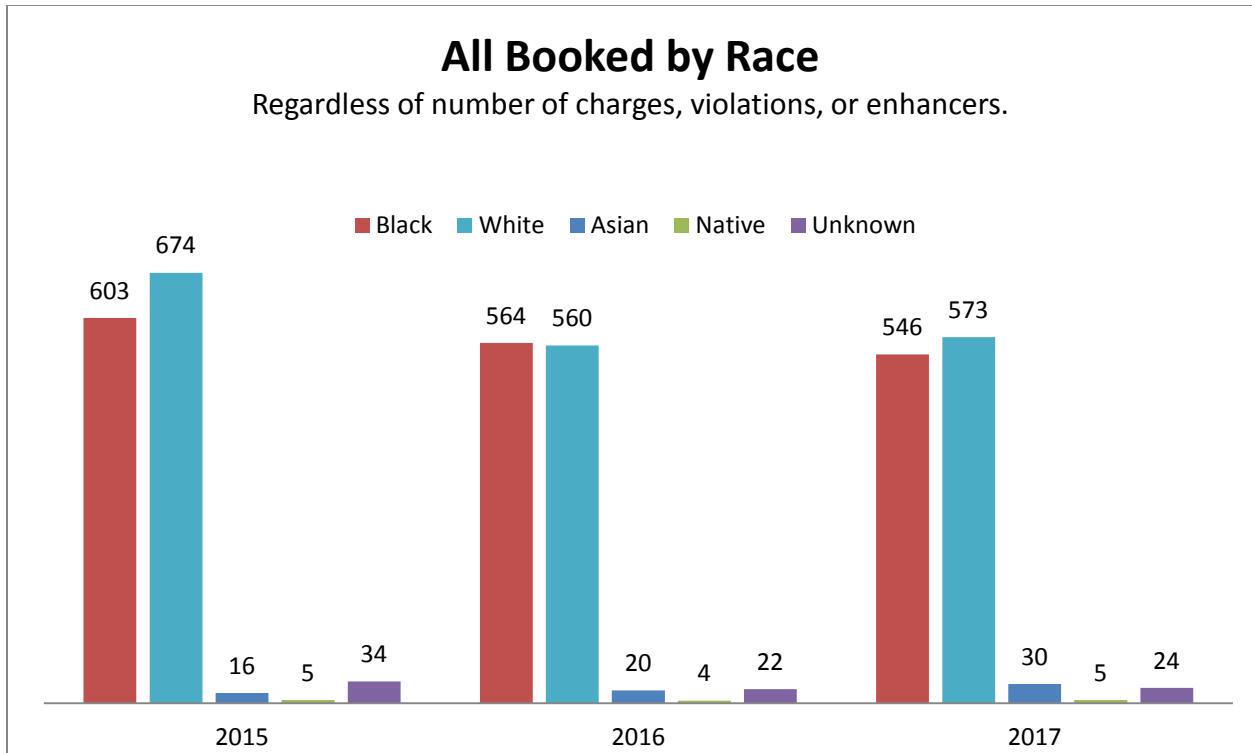
Reviewing disorderly conduct as a primary and single charge in offenses, the total number of arrests that lead to booking are 1,210 for the 2015-2017 time frame. The total for this single charge arrest number does not factor in the following: domestic enhancers, weapons enhancers, habitual enhancer, or probation or parole violation charges. When present on a booking record, a probation and/or parole violation are listed as separate (statute) charges and change the count of charges on a booking to 2 or more charges.

Analyzing the number of enhancers among these single charge bookings, we find that **64.35%** of bookings have one or more enhancers. The 5 enhancers included in this analysis are: three types of domestic violence enhancers, possession of a weapon, and habitual offender. Although this is not an exhaustive list of all possible enhancers, these enhancers were found to be common amongst these bookings and are considered important to this analysis.

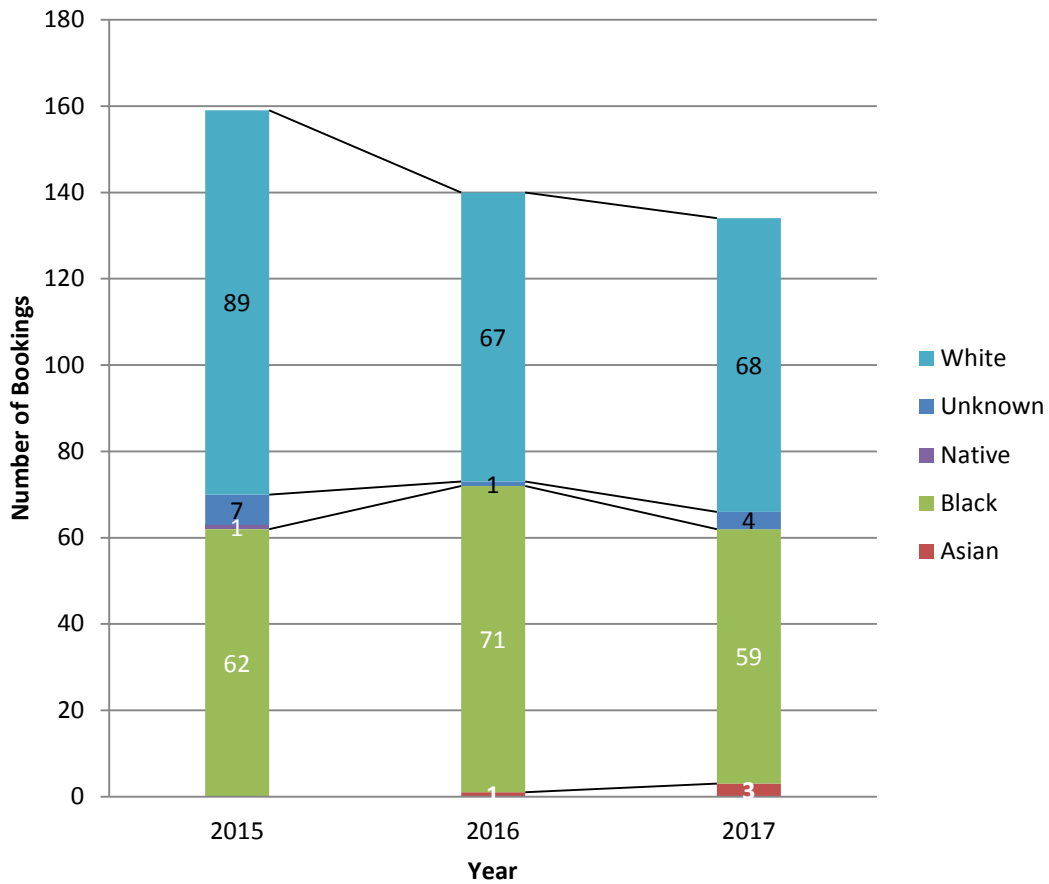


The enhancers are limited to: Domestic (3 types), Habitual, and Weapons.





Single Charge Bookings No Enhancers by Race

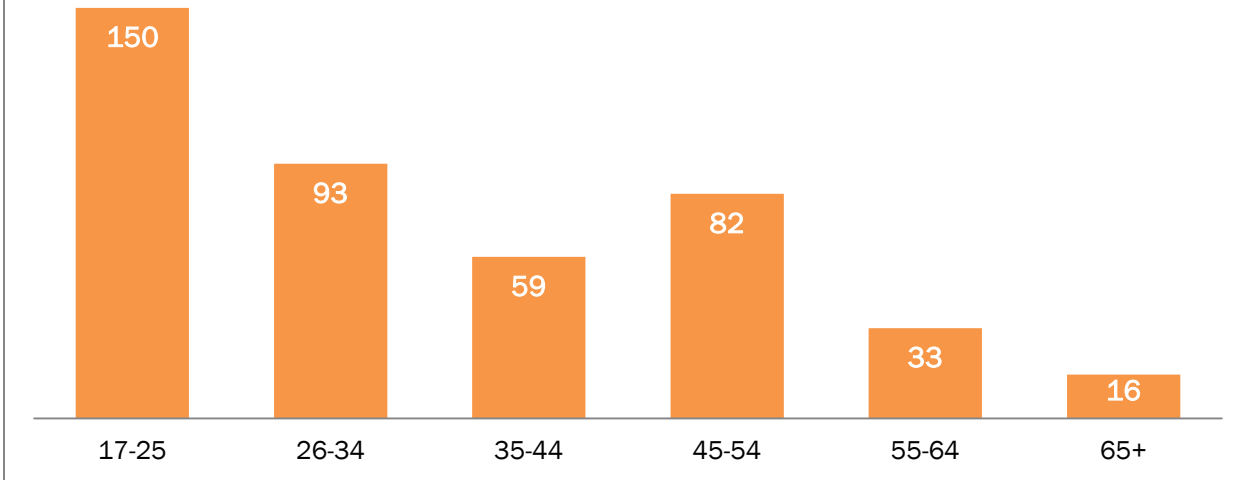

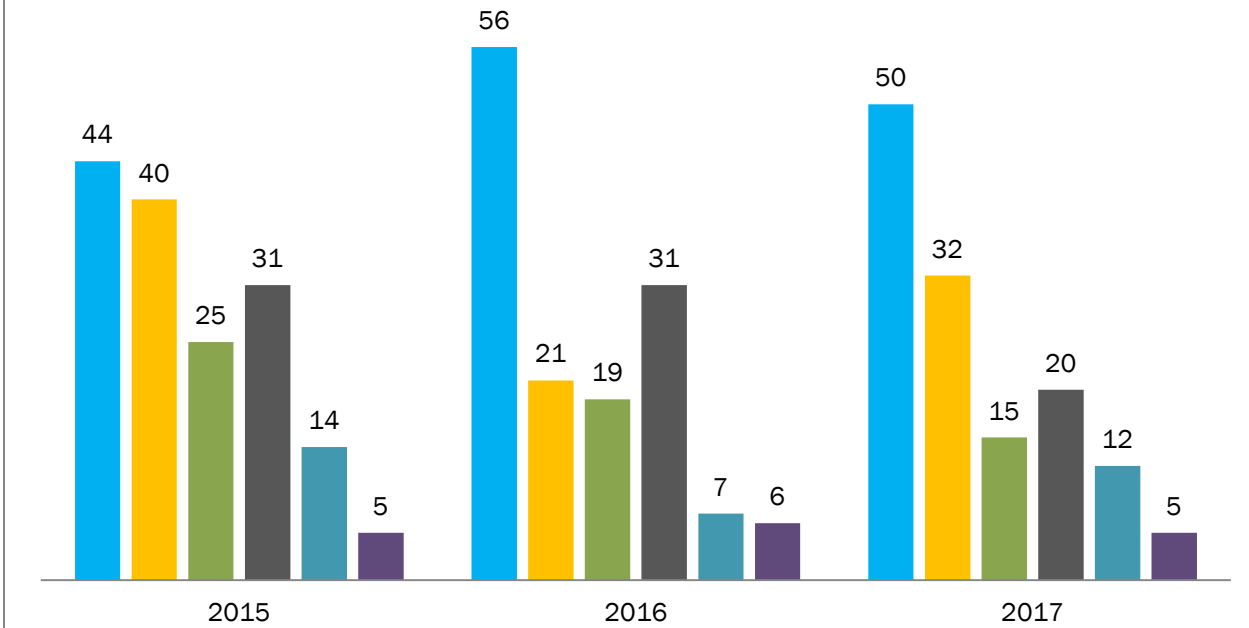
3 Year Totals for Single DC Charge, No Enhancers
